What

Social Security's free and voluntary Ticket to Work program supports career development for people with disabilities who want to work. The Ticket program helps disability beneficiaries test their ability to work and earn their way off of cash benefits.

Why

- ✓ Individual case management
- ✓ Protection from disability medical reviews¹
- ✓ SSA Work Incentives counseling
- ✓ Information on how to maintain Medicare and Medicaid while working
- ✓ Assistance navigating the Public Workforce System

How

Beneficiaries can research participating organizations, known as Employment Networks (ENs), to find the right combination of supports that will assist them in reaching their work goals. A beneficiary may work with only one EN at a time but can start and stop at any time. To assign the Ticket, the beneficiary and EN work together to develop an Individual Work Plan.

Who

Everyone age 18 through 64 who receives Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and/or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) is eligible to participate in the Ticket to Work program. To figure out if Ticket to Work is right for you, visit www.chooseworkttw.net.

¹Protection from medical continuing disability reviews (CDR) while participating in the Ticket to Work program requires ticket users to make timely progress toward self-supporting employment. Timely progress is the SSA standard used to determine if a beneficiary is successfully participating in the Ticket to Work program.
